TOMAHAWK PIPES



These pipes are made to look like tomahawks and come in different styles and sizes. They are made wholly from brass or aluminum. Some styles have a teak wood handle. The large pipes measure about 18" long with 6" to 8¼" heads. The mini pipes measure between 7½" and 10½" long with 2½" to 3½" heads. The heads may come plain or with designs

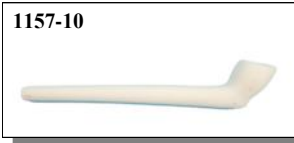

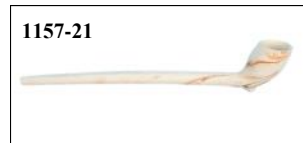
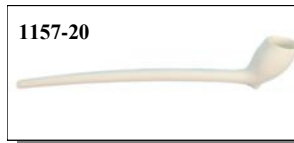
CLAY PIPES



The English style is from the mid 18th century to mid 19th century. They have a straight stem. They are 8.25" long with a 0.75" bowl.

The Elizabethan style is from the mid-17th century to early 18th century. They are 4.25" long with a 0.5" bowl.

All of the clay pipes are modeled after original pieces from the 1600s through the late 1800s which make them suitable for re-enactors of the French and Indian War, Civil War, Pow Wows, Revolutionary War, Mountain man portrayals, and others. The clay pipe will provide you with the true taste of tobacco without compromising quality or integrity.



The Colonial Gouda style is from the late 17th century to late 18th century. They have a curved stem and bulbous bowl. They are 7" long with a 0.75" bowl.
